



TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

The University has followed credit system and grading system for B.Ed. and B.Ed (Special) programmes from the academic session 2013-2014. The system of award of grades based on absolute marks obtained by a candidate is as follows- For Absolute Marks Range 90-100, Grade-S is awarded having Grade Point value of 10; For Absolute Marks Range 80-89, Grade-A is awarded having Grade Point value of -9; For Absolute Marks Range 70-79, Grade-B is awarded having Grade Point value of 8; For Absolute Marks Range 60-69, Grade-C is awarded having Grade Point value of 7; For Absolute Marks Range 50-59, Grade-D is awarded having Grade Point value of 6; For Absolute Marks Range 40-49, Grade-E is awarded having Grade Point value of 5, 4 Grade points are awarded for papers cleared through 'Grace' and 0 Grade points are awarded for absolute marks range 0-39.

2. The total number of credits for theory component of B.Ed./ B.Ed. (Special) in 1st, 2nd and 4th Semester are 20, 20, 12 respectively. The total semester-wise credit for practical components in 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Semesters in B.Ed. and B.Ed. (Special) are 4, 4, 10 and 4 respectively. As per the rule approved by the Academic Council and Executive Council of the University, Ordinances of B.Ed. and B.Ed. (Special) program provide the following formula for calculation of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

CGPA (at the end of 4th Semester) = [Total sum of (credits x grade points) obtained in semester I to IV] ÷
Summation of credits of 1st to 4th semester

3. In the certificate issued to the passed out candidates of B.Ed. and B.Ed. (Special) program, aforesaid formula has been used to calculate:

- (i) **Overall CGPA** (in which credits and grade points of theory and practical components are included),
- (ii) **Overall CGPA of Theory components** (in which credits and grade points of only theory components are included) and
- (iii) **Overall CGPA of Practical Components** (in which credits and grade points of only practical components are included)

4. It is further informed that based on the provisions of the Ordinances of aforesaid programmes, conversion of CGPA to Percentage of marks has been derived by using the following formula $X = 10Y - 4.5$, where 'X' is derived percentage of marks, and 'Y' is CGPA.

5. It is informed that due to difference in weight of the Theory and practical components and splitting of theory and practical components for calculation of CGPA (Theory) and CGPA (Practical), the overall CGPA/ derived percentage/Marks cannot be mathematically obtained by averaging the separately presented percentage/derived marks obtained by the candidates in theory and practical. Therefore, it is advised that for determination of merit of a candidate, overall CGPA, corresponding derived overall percentage of marks and total overall obtained marks be only taken into account.

The separate presentation of CGPA (Overall), CGPA (Theory) and CGPA (Practical) and corresponding percentage/ marks has been done on the request of the candidates.
